



# EPS HEPP 2007 Conference Final Bulletin



We look forward to meeting you in Manchester. This bulletin contains the information you need to know before you get here.

## Locations

Registration and parallel sessions (Wednesday-Saturday) are based in the Physics Department (also known as the Schuster Laboratory) which is on Brunswick Street, marked S on the attached map. Some sessions occur in the Roscoe and Chemistry buildings (marked R and C) immediately adjacent.

If you are staying in accommodation we arranged, this is in 4 buildings (Day's Inn, Weston Hall, Chandos Hall, Wright Robinson Hall) in a cluster together on Sackville Street/Altrincham Street and marked D, W, Ch and WR on the map. Day's Inn is also known as Day's Hotel – they are the same. The accommodation is 5-10 minutes walk from the Physics Department. (Umbrellas will be provided so you don't need to bring one!)

Plenary sessions (Monday-Wednesday) are in the Bridgewater Hall, Lower Moseley Street (marked B).

## Arrival in Manchester

If you arrive at Manchester Airport, there are frequent trains to Piccadilly Station (marked P) which is right next to the accommodation. These cost £2.80 or £3.40 depending on the time of day. Or you can take a taxi at a cost of about £25. Alternatively, the number 43 bus goes from the airport to the University.

If you arrive at Liverpool Airport, there is a bus once an hour to Manchester Piccadilly, the AirLink 700 (see <http://www.liverpooljohnlennonairport.com/>, then click 'getting to/from jla' then click 'by bus') which takes about an hour and costs £6. Or you can take an 81A bus, roughly every 30 minutes, to Hunt's Cross Station and then a train to Piccadilly. You can take a taxi but it is expensive (~£70).

If you are coming by car, you can take the M56 which turns into the A5103 and comes into Manchester from the South. Follow signs for 'Universities' and then for the Aquatics Centre Car park on Booth Street East (see map) where pay parking is available.

## Accommodation

If you have booked accommodation with us you can (if you prefer) go to it before registration. They are open 24 hours a day.

## Registration

Registration will be available in the Physics department:

2:00pm-7:00pm on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup>

8:00am-6:00pm on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup>

8:00am-6:00pm on Friday 20<sup>th</sup>

8:00am-1:00pm on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup>

and in the Bridgewater Hall

8:00am-5:00 pm on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup>-Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup>.

If you have paid, then registration should be swift and easy. However, if you have paid recently by bank transfer we may not have received your payment yet, and if your institution has paid then we may not have been sent enough information to link specific individuals to specific payments. (It is amazing how many things can go adrift in sending money.) For this reason we ask you to please bring documentation of the payment with you to speed up the registration process.

If you are paying at registration, then our preferred payment methods (i.e. those which will make the process as swift and easy as possible) are

1: Cheque drawn on a UK bank account

2: Cash (UK pounds)

3: Credit Card (you will be asked to pay online through PayPal)

If you need UK currency, there are banks in the nearby Precinct Centre (PC on map).

## Computing

Wireless will be available in the Physics Department and in the Bridgewater Hall (though not in the lecture rooms!). A cluster of PCs will be available in the Chemistry building. This will be available throughout the conference – there will no computer cluster at the Bridgewater Hall.

## Talks

If you are giving a talk, we hope you will have followed the instructions you have been given and have uploaded it onto the Indico Server. Even if your talk is not quite final, we would be grateful to have a preliminary version (to check font compatibility): this can always be updated.

Otherwise please bring your talk on a memory stick, and go to the Speakers Desk (same place as Registration) and upload it there.

If your talk is on your laptop, it must be uploaded to the Indico server via the net or using a memory stick. There will be a Scientific Secretary for your session who will help as required. With this number of parallel talks we cannot go through the complexities of connecting individual laptops to the data projection system.

Some rooms for the parallel sessions will have microphone/PA system but not necessarily all of them.
